

Arctic Adventure Home Learning Challenges: Spring Term

From the activities below, we would like you to choose and complete at least 4 of the challenges. You must choose one Maths and one English activity and at least 2 from the choice box. You can earn up to 2 merits for each activity completed. Please return your books to school on Monday 11th March. Do your best and have fun!

Maths

- Year 1: Create some fact families for adding and subtracting e.g. $3 + 5 = 8$, $5 + 3 = 8$
 $8 - 3 = 5$, $8 - 5 = 3$.
- Year 2: Create some fact families for dividing and multiplying e.g. $8 \times 5 = 40$, $5 \times 8 = 40$, $40 \div 5 = 8$, $40 \div 8 = 5$. You could use some pictures to show this too
- Y1 & Y2: Make a pictogram of your family's favourite polar animals.
- Y1 & Y2: Keep a diary of the temperature in Bury and the temperature in the Arctic for a week. What do you notice?



English

- Write a set of instructions about how to build a snowman (if we have snow you could make one too).
- Write 5 questions you would like to ask Scott of the Antarctic.
- Write a book review of a story that you have read that is set in a snowy place.
- Write an acrostic poem about the Arctic.

Choice Box

- Write a prayer about caring for God's creatures.
- Draw/paint/make a collage of a snowy landscape with some of the animals that might live there.
- Imagine you were going to the North Pole. What would you put in your back pack and why?
- Explain how 2 different polar animals are suited to live in their environment.
- Label the world's oceans and continents on a map.
- Build a den for a polar bear - you could use boxes, Lego, sticks - just be creative!
- Record yourself singing the continents song on Seesaw
