

## 'Queen Elizabeth I and Queen Victoria' Home Learning Challenges (Autumn)

Please look at the activities below. We would like you to choose and complete at least 4 of the challenges. You must choose one Maths and one English activity and at least 2 from the choice box. You can earn up to 2 merits for each activity completed. Please return your books to school on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

### Maths

- Y1 - Can you write out numbers to 20 in words and numerals?
- Y1 - Practise counting objects in twos-you could use pairs of socks, blocks, shoes! You might even want to upload a video of you doing it to Seesaw.
- Y2 - Practise counting sets of objects in 2s, 3s, 5s, and 10s. You could post a video on Seesaw to show your teacher!
- Y2 - Can you go on a 2-digit number hunt around your house? Use < > = symbols to compare some of the numbers you find.

### English

- If you could be a King or Queen for just one day, what would you do? Have a big party? Give everyone the day off school? Provide free food for all the homeless? Write some sentences explaining your rules!
- Research Queen Elizabeth I or Queen Victoria. When was she born? Who was in her family? What kind of Queen was she? Was she good and kind? Did she treat the poor people well? Was she popular? Did she ever get married and have children? Create a fact file of information you find on her.
- Can you create your own short story about a King/Queen? You could draw some pictures or write it in words or even upload yourself sharing your story to Seesaw!

### Choice Box

- Research medieval/Victorian food. What kind of food was eaten in those times? You could make something to eat and share with your family- take a picture of your creation before eating and add to Seesaw.
- With parents/carers watch an episode of Horrible Histories featuring one of the Queens OR watch The Tudor Queen Girl Power song on YouTube.

- Many famous portraits were painted of both Queens. Can you paint or draw your own self portrait?

- Design and make your own royal jewellery fit for a King or Queen!
