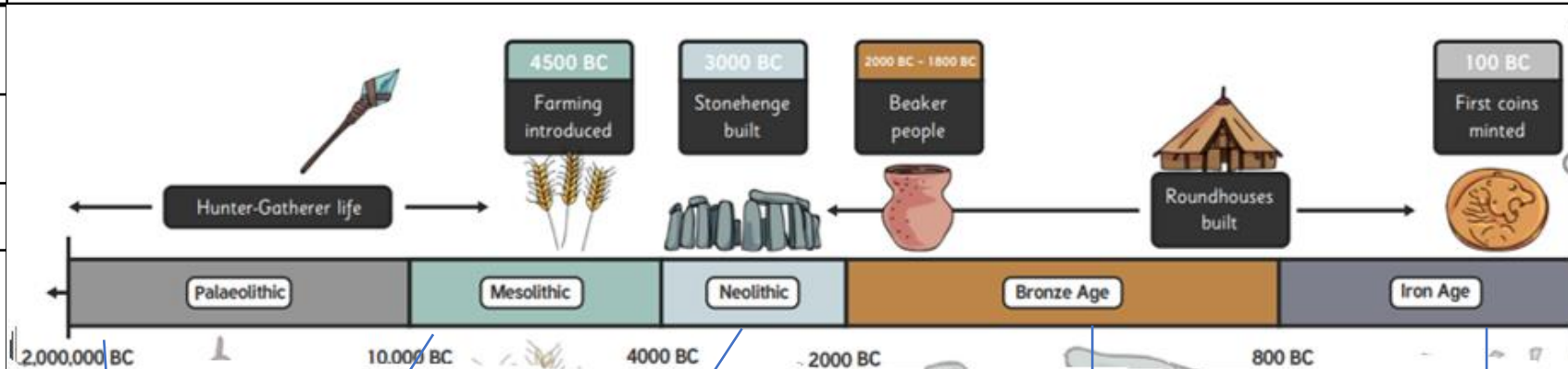


# Year 3 Autumn 1 – Stone Age to the Iron Age – Who first lived in Britain?

Artefact	Objects made by human beings.
Excavation	Digging out artefacts from the ground.
Tribal	Thing belonging to a tribe.
Shelter	A place giving temporary protection from bad weather or danger.
Archaeologist	a person who studies human history and prehistory through artefacts and other remains.
Domestication	The process of taming an animal and keeping it as a pet or on a farm.
Iron ore	Rocks and minerals from which metallic iron can be extracted.
Prehistory	the period of time before written records.
Preserve	To keep an object safe from loss.
Settlement	A place where people have built a community.
Hunter-gatherers	People who live by hunting and fishing, and harvesting wild food.

## Sticky Knowledge



People started to settle, grow crops to eat and capture smaller animals that they could milk, skin for hides/fur and kill for meat/bone for food and tools.

People made bronze from mixing molten tin and copper. It was easier to shape than stone, bone and antler. They could create tools, weapons and jewellery.

Iron became more available and there was a rise in weapons that shows people were fighting more.

People were hunter gatherers. They moved frequently following the animals they hunted and gathered fruits and berries when they could.
