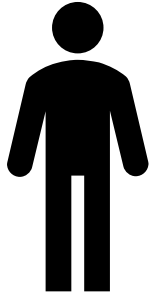

grey trousers or shorts; sky blue polo shirt; blue round-necked sweatshirt or fleece with logo, black school shoes (not black trainers)



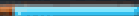
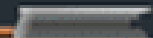

Expectations

- Inclusive classroom where we promote a positive mindset e.g. mistakes happen

Curriculum

- Our curriculum focuses can found on our class page/Maple newsletter - this gets updated half-termly.
- Daily English and maths
- Whole class reading at least twice a week
- History and geography are taught discretely
- Knowledge organisers are on the class page and show you what children will learn in science, history and geography. This can support with any home learning.

Reading

- At least two weekly whole class guided reading sessions. Different forms of media, genres and comprehension skills
- Daily independent reading with book of choice
- Weekly home reader. Book and reading record signed and returned every Thursday
- Visit the school library every other Thursday to read at home.

Additional support

- If your child is struggling with a concept in maths, they may use 'clinic'. A quick intervention that day to cover any misconceptions or help with methods.
- Supported writing and reading groups may differ throughout the half term depending on content.
- Resources, website links, methods may be shared on Seesaw to support with home learning

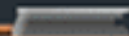
