Answers and Explanations



Spelling Reasoning: Rule 23: cial / tial

1. partial

- Contains the word part
- par not parr (vowel does not need protecting – also the same as the word part)
- ti-al not ci-al (shl ending is not after a vowel Tip: vowels are spec i al)

2. artificial

- ar not arr (vowel does not need protecting

 also the same as the word art)
- tif not tiff the stress is on the first syllable when you read the word (<u>artificial</u>) so you do not need to double the 'f'
- *i* not *e* (say the word clearly)
- ci-al not ti-al (shl ending is after a vowel –
 Tip: vowels are spec i al)

3. essential

- ess not es the stress is on the first syllable when you read the word (essential) so the vowel does need protecting
- en not enn (vowel does not need protecting)
- ti-al not ci-al (shl ending is not after a vowel Tip: vowels are spec i al)

4. crucially

- cru not croo 'oo' sound before a 'shl' ending is often spelt 'u'
- ci-al not ti-al (shl ending is after a vowel –
 Tip: vowels are spec i al)
- Iy suffix. The word crucial already ends in an 'l' so it will have two 'l's when the suffix is added.

5. presidential

- Contains the word preside and president
- pres not prez the 'z' sound in a long word is usually spelt with an 's'
- *i* not *e* (say the word clearly)
- den not denn (vowel does not need protecting)
- ti-al not ci-al (shl ending is not after a vowel Tip: vowels are spec i al)

6. influential

- Links to the word influence
- *in* not *inn* (vowel does not need protecting)
- flu not flew 'oo' sound before a 'shl' ending is often spelt 'u'
- en not enn (vowel does not need protecting)
- ti-al not ci-al (shl ending is not after a vowel Tip: vowels are spec i al)

7. beneficial

- Root word is benefit
- ben not benn (same as in the word benefit)
- e not i (say the word clearly same as in benefit)
- fi not fe (say the word clearly same as in benefit)
- ci-al not ti-al (shl ending is after a vowel –
 Tip: vowels are spec i al). Be careful as
 the root word benefit ends in a 't'.

8. consequentially

- Links to the word sequence
- con not conn (vowel does not need protecting)
- se not si (say the word clearly same as in sequence)
- quen not kwen ('kw' sound is usually spelt qu)
- ti-al not ci-al (shl ending is not after a vowel Tip: vowels are spec i al)
- Iy suffix. The word consequential already ends in an 'l' so it will have two 'l's when the suffix is added.
