# **Answers and Explanations**



# Spelling Reasoning: Rule 19: sure / ture

#### 1. closure

- Linked to the word close
- *clo* not *cloa* (same as root word *close*)
- closure not cloture (say in a 'posh voice' to see which sounds right: syur or tyur – this also links to the root word close)

#### 2. future

- 'you' sound in a word is often spelt 'u'
- future not fusure (say in a 'posh voice' to see which sounds right: tyur or syur)

#### 3. moisture

- Root word is moist
- 'oy' sound in the middle of a word is usually spelt 'oi' (unless it is before a vowel)
- moisture not moistsure (say in a 'posh voice' to see which sounds right: tyur or syur – this also links to the root word moist)

#### 4. treasure

- 'e' sound in this word is spelt *ea* (the same as in *measure* and *pleasure*)
- trea<u>sure</u> not trea<u>ture</u> (say in a 'posh voice' to see which sounds right: syur or tyur)

## 5. departure

- Contains the word part
- *de* not *di* (say the word clearly)
- par not parr (same as in part)
- departure not departsure (say in a 'posh voice' to see which sounds right: tyur or syur – this also links to the root word part)

#### 6. manufacture

- man not mann (same as in manual)
- 'you' sound in a word is often spelt 'u'
- 'k' sound is usually spelt 'c' in a long word (except for in compound words)
- manufac<u>ture</u> not manufac<u>sure</u> (say in a 'posh voice' to see which sounds right: tyur or syur – this also links to the word fac<u>t</u>ory)

### 7. composure

- Linked to the word *compose*
- com not comm (vowel does not need protecting)
- 'oh' sound before a sure / ture ending is often spelt 'o'
- compo<u>sure</u> not compo<u>ture</u> (say in a 'posh voice' to see which sounds right: syur or tyur – this also links to the root word pose)

## 8. agriculture

- Contains the word cult and culture
- ag not agg (vowel does not need protecting)
- ri not ree (say the word clearly also the 'ee' sound in a long word is often spelt with an 'i')
- cul not cull (vowel does not need protecting)
- agricul<u>ture</u> not agricult<u>sure</u> (say in a 'posh voice' to see which sounds right: tyur or syur – this also links to the word cul<u>t</u>)
