Either research or make up your own code. Write a coded message to a friend; remember to include the solution! (Up to 3 merits)

Imagine you are hosting a party to celebrate the end of the war. Plan food, decoration and entertainment. Make a persuasive poster or leaflet to advertise your party and to encourage people to attend. (3 merits)

Research wartime propaganda posters then create your own. Make sure your message is clear and your poster is eye-catching. (Up to 3 merits)

Make a model of **ANYTHING** at all related to either WW1 or WW2, using appropriate materials and decoration. (Up to 5 merits)

This term's homework combines our Topic and English work. Please complete a minimum of two and a maximum of four challenges. You should aim to spend about half an hour each week on your challenges. Any writing should be in your own words, please do not simply copy and paste from the internet. Take pride in each piece of work and have fun!!

What was The Christmas Truce in December 1914? How did it start? What happened and what did the soldiers do? When and why did it end? (Up to 4 merits)

Research and make a popular wartime recipe (remember: many ingredients were rationed!). Write the **full** instructions for how to make it. Take pictures of your creation and/or bring it in for the class to try. How did it taste? (Up to 5 merits)



Choose and research a significant character from either WW1 or WW2 (e.g. David Lloyd George, Emmeline Pankhurst, Alan Turing). Write their biography; what were their main achievements? Include pictures & sub headings. (Up to 4 merits)
